ABSENCES

We ask that all students arriving after 8:40am sign in at the office using the electronic tablet provided. The office staff will assist younger children with this. Parents / Caregivers will be contacted where ongoing patterns of lateness continue. It is expected that all students are on site before the 8:30am bell.

If your child will be more than half an hour late to school, need to be picked up early or will be absent - please fill in the Absence Web Form on our school website before 9am on that day: https://www.elim.school.nz/absence_form/

Please do not email or message the Teacher to say your child is going to be away or picked up early.

MEDICATION

No medicine to be held in school bag, please bring all medicine/inhalers/tablets to the office for safe keeping. If a child needs to take medicine at a certain time of day, please see Mrs Bishop in the office and she will make sure it will be given to them at the right time.

OFFICE - PARENT PASS

Parents please come through the office to get a Parent Pass - and not head straight up to their child's class during school hours. This is a safety process for all our students and staff. Please support us in coming to the office to take a Parent Pass.

POLICE VETTING

Please make sure your police-vetting documentation is up to date if you are keen to support with school activities. There is a \$10 administration fee to process Police Vetting Forms. Please ensure this is done as soon as possible, if you want to be a Parent Helper during our swimming sessions this term.

If we do not have enough adult helpers we will not be able to attend the lesson.



MITEY SNIPPET





MUFTI DAY - TERM 1, 2025

On March 27th, Elim Christian College will hold a \$2 school-wide mufti day to raise funds for the Tony McClean Nepal Trust.

In 2007, Tony McClean achieved one of his dreams – to visit Nepal, meet and live with the people and trek in the Himalayan mountains. During his six month stay, Tony taught in a local school at Pokhara. He spent much of his spare time with children in an orphanage, helping with sports activities and caring for the children. How he loved playing soccer on the rough ground outside the orphanage! He constantly commented how, even with so little, the children were always happy. Tony was keen to explore Nepal and went on a number of treks in the Annapurna region. One of Tony's attributes was his ability to build relationships with others, and during his stay he made contacts with people undertaking humanitarian projects in local villages.

Tony's life was tragically cut short when he died in the canyoning disaster at Mangatepopo, along with 6 students of Elim Christian College on 15 April 2008. Much of his planning to achieve his vision of helping the people of Nepal was found on his laptop, and hence the Tony McClean Nepal Trust has been formed to fulfill Tony's vision. The underlying principle of the trust is that the potential for people in the world can only be reached when those who have resources, share them with those who do not, for the benefit of both.

The Tony McClean Nepal Trust (TNT) works amongst the Shudra communities of the Lamjung, Gorkha and Pokhara regions of Nepal. The trust's activities are designed to meet the socio-economic, health, educational and spiritual needs of Shudra and other marginalized people.

One of the things they pride ourselves on is their low running costs as a trust. They entirely run by volunteers who are passionate about the cause, allowing 99.9% of all funds they raise end up over in Nepal making a difference in the lives of people they partner with.

ENTRY AND EXIT TO OUR SCHOOL SITE

TRAFFIC MOVEMENT AROUND OUR SCHOOL

This is a courtesy note on behalf of the Elim Christian College Board of Trustees to assist the school community in traffic movement around the Golflands Campus during drop-off and pick-up time. We are committed to continually improving the safety of our children.

Some tips to assist with improving safety:

We appreciate children being on time to school but if you are running late with your children, safety is still more important. You can simply take them to the office to sign in late.

Please use the Kea crossing before and after school.

Please do not u-turn in front of the school. Rather, use the side streets to loop around Bob Charles

Drive to get to the other side.

It is against traffic laws to park within 1 metre of a driveway.

You are not permitted to park on yellow no-parking lines.

No traffic is to enter the school bus bay during pick-up and drop-off times.

No double parking is permitted.

Child safety remains the highest priority and so all road rules must be followed around our school.
