### Dear Parents/Caregivers/Whānau

Welcome back to a new year at Elim Christian College! We hope your holidays have been wonderful and refreshing. Our Term 1 theme is, "God wants us to work". Students will be learning about the economic world and how God can use our strengths, skills and interests to work, serve and live for the kingdom of God.

This term, our school wide focus is:

**SCRIPTURE UNDERSTANDING AND APPLICATION**: We want to celebrate how students apply the Word of God in their lives. Students will have two larger passages of scripture to understand and apply each term. These verses relate to our Kotahitanga value for the term, with a hope to integrate character and scripture. On the homework sheet each week, there will be a copy of the scripture focus and discussion prompts for families to use at home. This is to help continue the conversation of scripture at home and deepen students' understanding and application of the verse.

During the term, students will be asked to demonstrate their understanding and application of the scripture and will be able to choose a way to do this. It may be through memorisation and explanation orally, through journaling, drama, song, art work or a recorded presentation.

# **SWIMMING LESSONS (YEAR 3 - 6 ONLY):**

Our Year 3 - 6 classes will also be participating in swimming lessons with the Community Swim programme this term. Eight 30-minute learn to swim lessons are delivered by qualified swimming instructors from the Swimgym swim school. The children are transported to and from school in special Community Swim buses.

The goal of the Community Swim Programme is to enable all children to develop the basic life skills of swimming and water survival skills. This aids them to realize the opportunities that await when the door to the world of aquatics is opened.

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The Community Swim Bus will pick each group up approximately 30 minutes before each lesson.

**PARENT HELP:** The school operates on the Ministry of Education's best practice. We have swimming lessons, class trips and activities planned for this year. These cannot go ahead if the adult:child ratio is not met.

All volunteers are required to hold a current police clearance. If you are unsure of your current police vetting status, please check with our admin staff. If you are not police-vetted via our school as yet, please note that this takes a few weeks to process.

### DROP OFF and PICK UP TIMES at Golflands Campus: as per Mr Adamson's Principal's update from 23 January 2025

As a school, we don't offer before or after school care. Regrettably, we are not resourced by the ministry to be able to do so. There are community groups that have some limited options for such care. We would encourage you to contact them regarding capacity.

At Golflands Campus the earliest that students are able to be at school is **8:15am**. Before this time there is no supervision or access to classrooms, toilets and safety provisions. Please do not drop students at school before this time.

All students need to be collected from school or have arrangements for their care in the afternoon by **3:30pm**. Beyond this time we begin to lock some buildings for security reasons and students are not allowed to remain unsupervised on site.
