making life richer in spite of the challenges. Perhaps this sentiment is best captured in the devotion given by our Head Girl, Terina Shaw, at the farewell assembly—the final assembly of the year for our senior students.

For many of us in the room today, this is our last assembly. The last time in our uniforms, the last time that we sit through another long assembly together, the last day of doing what we have done for the past 13 years. The last day of school may be one that you couldn't wait for anymore or it may be one that you wish never came. Nonetheless, it is a day to appreciate what we have accomplished throughout the year and to look towards the future.

So, you may have heard the saying before, "Life is like a mosaic." Each person you have ever known, everything you have ever experienced, every aspiration you plan to reach, forms parts of the artwork that is your life. The mosaic of your life has begun with your time at school, with pieces of all your teachers, friends, and other peers, but it does not make you all that you are.

In one of my devotions earlier this year, I spoke about the legacy that we leave behind. Asking you all to think about what values, traditions, culture, and history you will pass down. Each of us here today leave behind a piece of ourselves at Elim, forever adding to the artwork of our school. No matter how big or small you may think your impact was, it has left a lasting impression. Every single individual serves a purpose in the image, and without you all, the artwork would not be the same.

The mosaic of your life makes you who you are and establishes what you will carry out into the wider world with you. Each picture looks different, just as we all do. Even though some shards of glass can have imperfections, they can come together to form a beautiful artwork, because God has made us with intention and for a purpose.

Psalm 139:13-14 "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well".

Elim may be a part of you, but it is not all that you will go on to be. The Lord has made a plan for each of us and that plan is a good one. Not only does He set the plan, but He is with us every step of the way. As Proverbs 16:9 says, "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps."

I'm sure all of us have planned for something to go a certain way and it went completely differently. All the artists in the room will know that the final design doesn't always look like the intended piece. This is much like our lives and our futures. I know that it can be quite frightening to think about finishing school and what the future holds for us, but we can feel relieved knowing that God is our concrete. Our foundation. Our glue that holds the picture together. "It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed." - Deuteronomy 31:8. Art is ever-changing and increasing in complexity, just like all our lives. You don't need to be sure of where you might end up, but you can be sure that God will be with you all the way through it.

I leave you with some of the final words spoken by our Head Boy, Tydus Ah Kuoi, as part of the joint speech he delivered with Terina at the Senior Prizegiving.

When grafting a tree, there are two main components. The rootstock, and the scion. The lower part of the tree is called the rootstock and is used to form the roots, controlling the height of the tree. The scion is the upper portion which is responsible for fruit type, flavour and colour. Although Elim has many parts, we are rooted in one person, and that is Jesus. He is the one that makes us stand tall and strong and He is the one who grounds us firmly in good soil. He is our rootstock. And we each have been grafted together to bring a unique combination of flavours and colours to create one beautiful masterpiece.
